ORLANDO--- A car driven by an elderly woman smashed into the Sears store at Orlando Fashion Square mall Monday, coming to rest more than 20 feet inside the tool department, Orlando police said.

No one was injured in the 2:30 p.m. crash, though patrons and employees were inside the store at the time, spokeswoman Sgt. Barbara Jones said.

The Nissan Maxima passed shopping carts and took out a cash register and shelving before stopping against a support beam near the barbecue grills.

That no one was hurt is a surprise, considering the damage, Jones said.

"It's a miracle," she said.

All driver Elizabeth Jane Baldick, 84, of Orlando remembers is stopping, Jones said. Baldick told police that she had recently been to the doctor and a medical condition might have contributed to the crash, Jones said. Further information was not available.

Baldick was taken by ambulance to Orlando Regional Medical Center as a precaution.
